An effort has been made to limit the areal coverage to British Columbia, but it has been necessary to include a few works on regions just outside the boundaries of the Province. Defining what is Archaeology for bibliographic purposes is somewhat more difficult. Some of the items I have included could also appear in a bibliography of general anthropology. Most historically oriented ethnographic studies of British Columbia are listed in G. P. Murdock, Ethnographic Bibliography of North America, Human Relations Area Files Press, New Haven, 1960, and unless referenced by authors of the accompanying articles, have not been included here.
